Home Harbour Rules

1. Securing vessels alongside the berth:

- a. The vessel must be firmly secured.
- b. Mooring lines must correspond to the size of the vessel and be <u>designed for maritime use</u> (lines suitable for vessels weighing up to 2.5 tons can be purchased from the Harbour Master).
- c. All vessels over 6 m long must use amortizers (can be purchased from the Harbour Master).
- d. All vessels must use appropriate fenders to avoid damaging the vessels and the dock (can be purchased from the Harbour Master).
- e. If the wind speed is more that 10 m/s (especially if blowing from the northeast) the owner of the ship must come to the harbour and make sure that the vessel is securely in place and/or contact the harbour master to get an overview of the situation at the harbour.
- f. The harbour authority is not responsible for any damage to the ships; every shipowner is responsible for damages to their ship as well as any damage that their ship might cause to harbour facilities and other vehicles.

2. Parking arrangement:

- a. Every contractor is entitled to one parking space <u>on the harbour's premises</u>. Visitors of the <u>contractor must leave their vehicles outside the harbour area</u>.
- b. Parking on the stone pavement is not allowed (except for loading goods on recreational crafts).
- c. If the stone pavement has been soiled with grease etc, you must inform the harbour master immediately; the harbour has special absorbents that help reduce the damage.

3. The premises open for home harbour customers and their guests is:

- a. The main gate and the driveway, the main dock, the road on the northern breakwall, the floating dock.
- b. The harbour's pedestrian gate locks automatically at 20.00 and opens at 8.00.
- c. The remote control for the harbour's car gate can only be used by the shipowner or persons authorized by the shipowner; it is forbidden to pass the remote control on to third persons. The remote control for the car gate must be returned to the harbour master when the contract period ends.
- 4. A log entry must be made every time your vessels arrives to or leaves from the harbour. Ask the harbour master for details.
- 5. Smoking on the harbour's premises is allowed only in the designated area.
- 6. Only ship-generated domestic waste can be placed in the domestic waste container.
- 7. Avoid causing waves in the aquatic area of the harbour; maximum allowed speed is 3 knots.
- 8. Before using power and water supply at the dock please inform the harbour master (contact the harbour master for a water hose).
- 9. Standing by the dock with a working engine for long periods of time is not permitted.
- 10. Night-time at the harbour starts at 23.00 and ends at 8.00 avoid listening to loud music and causing noise during that time.
